Trail & Fishing Regulations

TRAIL REGULATIONS:

All pedestrians and bicyclists must stay on established trails.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times.

Pet waste must be disposed of properly in waste stations along the trail.

Trash must be either packed out or put into receptacles posted at points along trails.

No alcohol allowed.

Trails open dawn to dusk.

Harassment of wildlife is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

No unauthorized vehicle access.

No swimming.

No boats or floatation devices

FISHING REGULATIONS

Colorado State fishing regulations apply.

No ice fishing.

No boats or flotation devices.

Dogs on leash at all times.

Pick up all pet waste.

No bow fishing.

No swimming.

Fish only in designated areas (see trail map).

No alcohol.

Pack your trash in and out.

High Plains Environmental Center (HPEC) is a living laboratory providing integrated, leading-edge examples of community design, land stewardship, and eco-literacy right in the middle of The Lakes at Centerra.
